




THIS MONTH'S CLASS

WEEKLY CHECKLIST

- **WEEK 1:** Watch the class intro and make an "inspiration wall" with images, swatches, notes, and reflections on color, form, or texture.
- **WEEK 2:** Dive into the Color Studies lesson and fill sketchbook pages with palettes, textures, and labels for the emotions or ideas they evoke.
- **WEEK 3:** Explore the Fashion Sketches lesson and practice figure drawings layered with paint, pastel, notes, and swatches to enliven the page.
- **WEEK 4:** Try the Portrait and Abstract lessons, expand on toned paper or canvas if inspired, add final touches, and share your favorite spread.

BONUS SKETCHBOOK PROMPTS


- Make a collage spread of textures that inspire you: fabric, paper, paint swatches.
- Create a page of tiny color studies using unexpected palettes.
- Sketch a portrait from an old photograph, adding pastel or gouache.
- Use abstract marks and collage to create a "beauty map" of what you're drawn.
- Take one of your fashion sketches and reimagine it in different colors across a spread.
